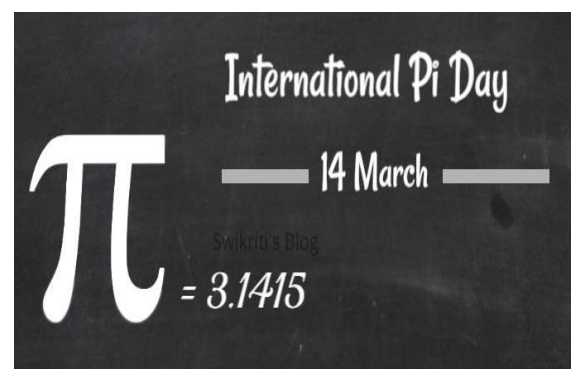


## INTERNATIONAL PI DAY
