What should have been a dream come true was shattered when the Swedish Migration Court denied visas to a group of young soccer players on the basis that their birth certificates do not have their biological fathers' details. Four of the seven affected players are members of our school, and it has been a bitter reminder of how unfair and discriminatory laws can be.

We are very grateful to one of our parents, Ms Theresa Massaglia who has made a huge effort to give the boys who were left behind something to feel good about. One of these experiences was a visit by Ryan Botha, an ex-professional footballer who came to talk to all the Grade 7s yesterday. He shared his story which included many examples of disappointment and how he dealt with each setback. It certainly helped our boys feel better. Thank you, Theresa and Ryan! To our boys, we are proud of you and how you have faced this huge disappointment.

The objective here is to lower our consumption so that when an inverter solution is found, the size of the plant required is smaller. In the long run this obviously also saves on overall consumption which is cost friendly and represents a greener approach.
